



# **States That Collect Recycling Data**

Does your state collect data on the total amount of residential materials collected through curbside programs annually?



 Congress directed EPA to collect recycling information from States and Territories in 2022

#### Findings:

- 54% of state respondents do not track the total amounts of materials collected in residential curbside recycling programs
- States and Territories need more resources to collect and improve recycling data

## Recycling Education and Outreach Grant Program

- Grant program for education and outreach projects that:
  - inform the public about recycling programs,
  - provide information about recycled materials and/or,
  - increase collection rates and decrease contamination.
- Total estimated funding for REO in Fiscal Year 2023 is approximately \$30,000,000.
- EPA anticipates awarding approximately 25 grants, with at least one grant per EPA region in amounts ranging from \$250,000-\$2,000,000 per award.






# **Funding Opportunity Overview**

## **Eligible Applicants**

- The eligible applicants for this funding opportunity are:
  - 50 U.S. states including Washington, DC
  - Puerto Rico; Virgin Islands; Guam; American Samoa and the Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands

 No more than one award will be made per state or territory.





# **Funding Available**

- \$30M total for round one
- Funding per award is based on a formula:
   \$300K \$500K plus additional funds based on programmatic factors (up to a max of \$1.5M).
- EPA intends to provide more funds to states and territories with less-developed waste management systems in place
- No match is required
- Not eligible for inclusion with a performance partnership grants (PPGs)
- May be included in territories' consolidated grants under the Omnibus Territories Act



# **Post-Consumer Materials Management**

- Municipal solid waste:
  - Plastics,
  - Organics (food and yard trimmings)
  - Paper
  - Metal
  - Glass, etc.
- Construction and demolition materials:
  - Concrete
  - Asphalt
  - Steel, etc.









# **Post-Consumer Materials Management**

- Management pathways:
  - Source reduction/Waste prevention
  - Recover, Reuse, Repair, Refurbish, Recycle
  - Composting
  - Rendering
  - Anaerobic digestion
  - Animal feed/ feeding animals











### **Scope of Work**

- Projects for states and territories may include:
  - 1. **Develop or update plans** to advance post-consumer materials management
  - 2. Develop, strengthen, and/or implement comprehensive data collection efforts that demonstrate progress towards the National Recycling Goal and Food Loss and Waste Reduction Goal
  - 3. Support the state-led implementation of plans
  - Only for territories: equipment and construction





# **Notice of Intent to Participate**

## What is a Notice of Intent to Participate?

- States and Territories that wish to receive this funding must submit a Notice of Intent to Participate (NOIP) to the EPA.
- A NOIP is simply an email to the EPA indicating that they wish to accept or decline the SWIFR funds. (<u>SWIFR@epa.gov</u>)
- You are welcome to use the Letter of Intent Optional Template that was included in the letter announcing the program as an enclosure.
- The NOIP is due to EPA by December 15, 2022.

## **Notice of Intent to Participate Process**

- 1. The EPA electronically sent letters to state and territory governors on November 15 to identify which states or territories wish to participate.
- State or Territory submits the NOIP to the EPA (<u>SWIFR@epa.gov</u>) and EPA Region by **December 15, 2022**
  - The NOIP must be from an official within the governor's office, the director of the designated agency, or other authorized official.
- 3. The EPA will confirm receipt of the NOIP and will work with the states and territories to answer questions and resolve any issues.


