Overview of 2012 CDR Requirements

Speaker: Susan Sharkey, CCD/ECB Acting Branch Chief

- The 2012 submission period is February 1 to June 30, 2012
- Manufacturers, including importers, of TSCA Inventory-listed chemical substances with a 2011 production volume of 25,000 lb or greater at a site, unless otherwise exempted.
- Important to Know:
 - Reporting is site-specific
 - Reporting standard is “known to or reasonably ascertainable by” for all data
 - CBI – upfront substantiation required for:
 - Site and chemical identity claims
 - Processing and use information claims [new requirement]



Overview of 2012 CDR – Reported Data Elements

Manufacturing-Related Data

- Chemical Identity
 - CAS RN and Chemical Name
 - Accession Number and Generic Chemical Name for CBI substances
- Production Volume (PV)

2011 Data	2010 Data
Domestically Manufactured PV	Total PV only
Imported PV	
Indicate whether chemical physically at reporting site	
Volume used at reporting site	
Volume directly exported from reporting site	

- Number of workers that are reasonably likely to be exposed (in ranges)
- Maximum concentration
- Indication of whether a manufactured chemical substance is being recycled, remanufactured, reprocessed or reused
- Physical form and percent production volume in the form

Overview of 2012 CDR – Reported Data Elements

Processing- and Use-Related Data

- Required for production volumes of 100,000 lb or more, at a site, unless otherwise exempted
- Industrial Processing and Use

Report up to 10 unique combinations:			For each unique combination, report:		
Industrial function category	Industrial sector	Functional use	Percent production volume	Number of reasonably likely to be exposed workers	Number of sites

- Commercial and Consumer Use

Report up to 10:	For each unique category, report:				
Product categories	Commercial or consumer?	Is use in a product intended for children?	Percent production volume	Maximum concentration	Number of reasonably likely to be exposed commercial workers

Overview of 2012 CDR Requirements

- **How to Report:**
 - Register with **EPA's Central Data Exchange (CDX)**
 - Complete form U using **e-CDRweb**, which is accessible through CDX
 - One Form U per site
 - Submit your completed report following the instructions in e-CDRweb
 - Paper submissions or submission on CD-ROM will no longer be accepted
- **Additional Assistance:**
