

# Ceanothus americanus

## New Jersey Tea



This small shrub grows in prairies, fields and open woodlands. The flowers bloom in mid-summer and can be dried to use in flower arrangements. A great addition to the perennial border. Drought and salt resistant. Sensitive to soil compaction, does not transplant readily once established.

**Suggested Companions:** little bluestem (*Schizachyrium scoparium*), June grass (*Koeleria macrantha*), wild strawberry (*Fragaria virginiana*), old-field goldenrod (*Solidago nemoralis*), fragrant sumac (*Rhus aromatica*), gray dogwood (*Cornus racemosa*)
