Wild Crab Apple



An excellent flowering tree for the home garden. Fragrant white flowers follow the emergence of leaves in the spring. The bright green foliage drops relatively early in fall, revealing pale green-yellow fruits. Irregular, rounded form.

Suggested Companions: wild strawberry (*Fragaria virginiana*), Virginia creeper (*Parthenocissus quinquefolia*)
