

Solidago riddellii

Riddell's Goldenrod



Flowers in dense, domed clusters. Short, for a goldenrod. Prefers wet sites. Goldenrods do not cause hayfever! They bloom at the same time as ragweed, a major offender.

Suggested companions: moisture-loving sedges (*Carex* sp.), mountain mint (*Pycnanthemum virginianum*), blazing star (*Liatris spicata*), New England aster (*Aster novae-angliae*)
