

# Eupatorium maculatum

## Joe Pye Weed



Also called spotted Joe Pye weed. Tall, and striking, with large, flat flower clusters of a deep, dusky pink. Stems are purple, and leaves are flecked with purple. A butterfly favorite. Reaches its greatest heights in moist, heavy soils; will stay more compact in drier or sandy soils.

**Suggested companions:** boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*), goldenrod (*Solidago* sp.), black-eyed susan (*Rudbeckia hirta*), blue vervain (*Verbena hastata*). Arborvitae (*Thuja occidentalis*) makes a nice evergreen backdrop.
