

Phytocarpus opulifolius

Ninebark



Very tough shrub, adaptable to a great range of conditions. Bark raggedly exfoliating in thin shreds and long, papery sheets, exposing orangish inner bark. Flowers in May or June, in white or pinkish flat-topped clusters. Light brown seed capsules persist through the winter. Transplants easily.

Suggested companions: silky dogwood (*Cornus amomum*), red-osier dogwood (*Cornus stolonifera*), blue vervain (*Verbena hastata*), boneset (*Eupatorium perfoliatum*), swamp milkweed (*Asclepias incarnata*), sensitive fern (*Onoclea sensibilis*)
