PLEASE NOTE: The annual C&T accomplishment reporting information that is required by 40 CFR Part 171, and which is discussed in item number four of the "*Worker Safety Reporting Requirements*" section of the worker safety guidance, must be submitted to EPA using the CPARD system. States/Tribes must submit their annual C&T accomplishment reporting information by December 31st of each year. States/Tribes must enter all of the required information in the reporting section of the database according to database instructions in order for the system to generate the required annual C&T report for EPA. Failure to accurately provide all of the required annual C&T accomplishment reporting information may affect future cooperative agreement funding levels since this reporting information is used in EPA's funding formulas for determining future C&T and enforcement program funding (as well as PSEP funding for the State Cooperative Extension Service). If States/Tribes have any questions regarding the process for submission of their C&T reporting information via the CPARD system, they should contact their EPA Regional C&T Program Coordinator for assistance.
