Thank you for your June 28, 2007 request for information regarding federally listed and proposed threatened and endangered species, candidate species, or critical habitat near your proposed project. Your request and this response are made pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of 1973, as amended (Act).

Our records do not indicate the presence of federally listed species or critical habitat in or near your proposed project. This precludes the need for further action on this project as required by the Act. If, however, more than six months pass, project plans change, or new information becomes available that indicates listed species or proposed species may be affected, you should conduct further consultation with this office.
