

## **MOST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT THE NEW RENOVATION, REPAIR AND PAINTING (RRP) RULE**

<b><i>What do I have to do to comply with the new rule?</i></b>	Take a one-day training course and apply for firm certification
<b><i>How many people must be trained in my company?</i></b>	One person if this person can train the other employees and oversee the work on all work sites.

<b><i>Where do I find the booklet Renovate Right which I must give to customers?</i></b>	You can copy the booklet from our website ( <a href="http://www.epa.gov/region09/lead">www.epa.gov/region09/lead</a> ).
<b><i>How is EPA going to enforce RRP?</i></b>	EPA will conduct enforcement based on tips and complaints, firms EPA identifies as operating without appropriate certification, and certified firms that EPA identifies as not following RRP requirements.
<b><i>What is the penalty for violating RRP?</i></b>	Penalties can be up to \$37,500 per violation. The penalty policy can be found under the policy and guidance link at <a href="http://www.epa.gov/compliance/civil/tsca">www.epa.gov/compliance/civil/tsca</a> .
