SUBJECT: Classification of Ethanol Fuel Plants under PSD

This is to clarify the proper classification for ethanol fuel plants for purposes of PSD applicability. The Agency regards any source listed under major Group 28 of the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) manual as a chemical process plant. Ethanol fuel is listed under SIC Group 286: Industrial Organic Chemicals. Ethanol fuel plants should therefore be considered a chemical process plant subject to the 100 tons per year threshold for PSD review.

Over the past few months this office has received several inquiries from industry and regional office representatives regarding conflicting interpretations of classification of ethanol fuel plants. In order to assure the success of the PSD program, it is important for all of the Offices within the Agency to issue consistent guidance.
