Funding: USDA RCPP Applications and Webinar for Projects that Can Protect Drinking Water Sources

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) has announced up to \$225 million in available funding for Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) projects. RCPP is a partner-driven program that leverages collective resources to find solutions to address natural resource challenges on agricultural land that can be aimed at protecting drinking water sources.

Regulation: EPA Announces the UCMR 5 Final Rule and Public Webinar Meetings

On December 20, 2021, EPA finalized the Fifth Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR 5) to establish nationwide monitoring for 29 per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and lithium in drinking water. This action is essential to addressing the public health and environmental risks of PFAS in drinking water and marks a significant milestone in EPA's <u>PFAS Strategic Roadmap</u>.

UCMR 5 final rule public webinars

EPA will host two identical virtual meetings to provide public water systems (PWSs), states, laboratories, and other stakeholders with a comprehensive overview of the UCMR 5 program. The meetings will address: a general introduction to the UCMR program, PWSs subject to UCMR 5 requirements, the analytes to be monitored, monitoring locations and frequency, reporting requirements, ground water representative monitoring plans (GWRMPs), and the laboratory approval program.

Webinar: Sampling Guidance for Unknown Contaminants in Drinking Water Webinar

This webinar is hosted by <u>EPA Water Security Division's Water Utility Resilience Workshops and Webinars.</u>

WLA's "Sampling Guidance for Unknown Contaminants in Drinking Water" is designed to provide utilities, emergency responders and laboratory personnel with comprehensive guidance that integrates recommendations for sample collection, preservation and transport procedures of unknown samples. By highlighting how to use the WLA's Sampling Guidance for Unknown Contaminants in Drinking Water, this webinar will examine recommendations for pathogen, toxin, chemical and radiochemical sample collection, preservation and transport procedures that support multiple analytical approaches for the identification of potential contaminants in drinking water. Participants will be presented with examples of what is required for a comprehensive sampling program, and how the guidance can be used to enhance laboratory, utility and emergency responder preparedness by supplementing emergency response plans.
