- A region-wide energy cost and consumption reduction program founded in 2007.
- Historic County & City Joint Electricity Purchasing Initiative
- Contracted Volume: 136,000,000 kWh
- Participating Entities: City of Pittsburgh, County of Allegheny, Pittsburgh Water and Sewer Authority, Pittsburgh Zoo and PPG Aquarium, Urban Redevelopment Authority, Carlow University and the Sports and Exhibition Authority
- 25% Green Energy




GM Account Auction
