Re: Title V Renewal Permit for Williams Four Corners, LLC, Los Mestenios Compressor Station in Rio Arriba County

Dear Chairman Frost:

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 6 is in the process of drafting a Title V operating permit to renew the operating permit for the Williams Four Corners (WFC), LLC Los Mestenios Compressor Station. This is an existing source that previously received a Title V operating permit from the EPA and the purpose of the Title V permit is to authorize the facility to continue operating equipment that produces emissions to the air. The Permit does not authorize any new construction at the source.

The WFC Los Mestenios Compressor Station is located on Jicarilla Apache Nation Lands, Rio Arriba County, New Mexico in the San Juan Basin (15 miles NW of Gavilan, New Mexico at Latitude: 36° 27' 3" N; Longitude: 107° 19' 2" W). The renewal proposes a continuance of operations and a correction of emission rates, as follows:

The EPA is initiating consultation with the Jicarilla Apache Nation on this permit application. This consultation process will be conducted in accordance with the *EPA Policy on Consultation and Coordination with Indian Tribes* (http://www.epa.gov/tribal/epa-policy-consultation-and-coordination-indian-tribes). The EPA invites you and your designated consultation representative(s) to participate in this process. The EPA's anticipated timeline for the consultation and coordination period is expected to extend from the date of receipt of this letter until May 9, 2017.
