Chapter 135 -- Reporting of Sources

GENERAL

§ 135.1. Definitions.

The following word, when used in this Chapter, shall have the following meaning, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

Modification - Any alteration which will, or might reasonably be expected to, change the amount, effect or characteristics of the air contaminants discharged.

§ 135.2 Applicability.

This chapter applies all sources except the following:

- (1) A mobile air contamination source.
- (2) A source which emits nonspecific particulate matter only and for which the actual emission rate is less than 1 ton per year.
- (3) A source which emits only carbon dioxide, water vapor, nitrogen, oxygen or inert gases such as argon, helium, krypton, neon, or xenon.
 - (4) A combustion unit rated at less than 2,500,000 Btu's per hour of heat input.
 - (5) A source used in residential premises designed to house four or less families.
- (6) Other sources and classes of sources determined to be of minor significance by the Department.

§135.3 Reporting.

- (a) Any person who owns or operates a source, to which this Chapter applies, shall submit to the Department a source report within 120 days after the receipt of a source reporting form, unless a time extension has been granted by the Department. Source reports shall be made on source reporting forms and shall be complete.
- (b) Any person who has received a source reporting form or any person who has reported a source to the Department pursuant to the requirements of subsection (a) of this section shall comply with the requirements of subsection (a) of this section within 90 days of the acquisition and operation of any additional source.
- (c) Any person who has reported a source to the Department pursuant to the requirements of

subsection (a) of this section, shall report any modifications to, installation of any air cleaning device on, or permanent cessation in operations of said source within 90 days after the completion of such modification or installation or cessation; reports concerning such modification or installation shall contain sufficient pertinent information to enable the Department to determine the effect on emissions of the modification or installation.

§ 135.4. Reporting forms and guides.

A statement of guidelines, reporting forms, and instructions shall be published and made available by the Department. The statement shall serve as a basic manual of guidance for the reporting of Information required by the Chapter.

§ 135.5. Recordkeeping

Source owners or operators shall maintain and make available upon request by the Department records including computerized records that may be necessary to comply with §§135.21 (relating to reporting; and emission statements). These may include records of production, fuel usage, maintenance of production or pollution control equipment or other information determined by the Department to be necessary for identification and quantification of potential and actual air contaminant emissions. If direct recordkeeping is not possible or practical, sufficient records shall be kept to provide the needed informed by indirect means.
