

NOTICE for PUBLIC COMMENT

PRASA Corozal Water Treatment Plant Corozal, Puerto Rico

SUMMARY

The Puerto Rico Aqueduct and Sewer Authority (PRASA) has applied for renewal of its National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit for the Corozal Water Treatment Plant (WTP) in Corozal.

The Corozal Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is a filtration plant that treats water from Corozal River and Don Carlos Dam at Dos Bocas River to provide clean drinking water to the residents of the Municipality of Corozal. Wastewater from the treatment plant is discharged to the Corozal River.

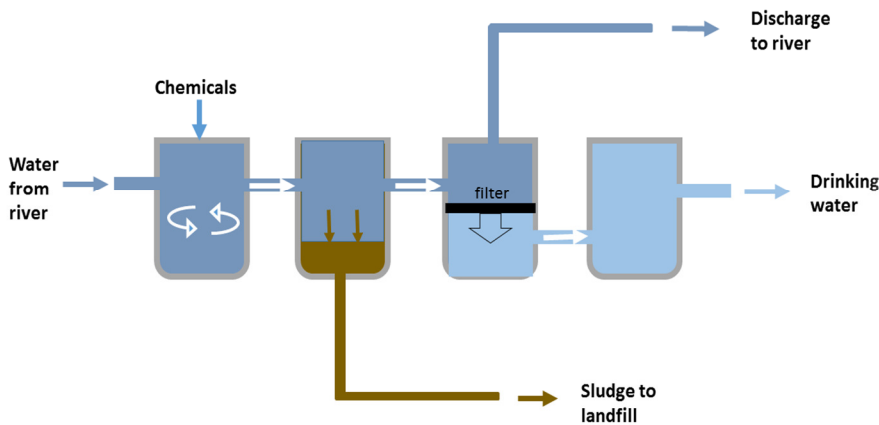
The NPDES permit ensures that the amount of discharge and the amount of contaminants in the discharge remains below levels that are safe for the environment and public health consumption.

DRAFT PERMIT CONDITIONS

The permit establishes numeric water quality effluent limitations for several pollutants, including pH, dissolved oxygen, temperature, taste and odor, color, turbidity sulfates, total ammonia, suspended solids, and metals.

The permit limits the WTP's numeric flow effluent pursuant to Puerto Rico Environmental Quality Board (PREQB) Water Quality Certificate, Puerto Rico Water Quality Standards NPDES Regulations (40 CFR Part 122).

Under NPDES the permit specifies requirements for recording and reporting monitoring results of the numeric effluent limitations described above.

How to Submit Public Comments

Any interested parties can submit written comments on the draft permit during the public comment period which ends May 19, 2016. During this time, a public hearing can also be requested on these documents.

The request must:

1. Be in writing
2. State the issues that you want to be raised in the hearing
3. Be submitted to the Director of the Caribbean Environmental Protection Division Office
