- The parties enter into this Clean Air Act Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement (Agreement) in order to settle the civil violations discovered as a result of the inspection specified in Table 1, attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. The civil violations that are the subject of this Agreement are described in Table 2, attached, incorporated into the Agreement by reference, regarding the vehicles/engines specified therein.
- Respondent admits to being subject to the Clean Air Act (CAA) and its associated regulations and that
 the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has jurisdiction over the Respondent and
 the Respondent's conduct described in Table 2. Respondent does not contest the findings detailed
 therein, and waives any objections Respondent may have to the EPA's jurisdiction.
- 3. Respondent consents to the payment of a penalty in the amount of \$4,200, further described in Table 3, attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Respondent agrees to follow the instructions in "CAA Mobile Source Expedited Settlement Agreement Instructions," attached, incorporated into this Agreement by reference. Respondent certifies that the required remediation, detailed in Table 3, has been carried out.
- 4. By its first signature below, the EPA approves the findings resulting from the inspection and alleged violations set forth in Table 1 and Table 2. Upon signing and returning this Agreement to the EPA, Respondent consents to the terms of this Agreement without further notice. Respondent acknowledges that this Agreement is binding on the parties signing below, and becomes effective on the date of the EPA Air Enforcement Division Director's ratifying signature.

The 78 gasoline generators described below (the Subject Generators) were found to be uncertified with respect to new small sparkignition equipment and engine standards under Title II of the Clean Air Act (CAA), implemented by regulations at 40 C.F.R. Parts 1054, 1060, and 1068. Imported nonroad equipment containing engines of the size and model year as the Subject Generators are required to be covered by both exhaust emissions and evaporative emissions certificates of conformity (COCs) issued by EPA, and include exhaust and evaporative emission control information labels at the time of importation. The Subject Generators were imported without being covered by an evaporative emissions COC as required at the time of importation, because they were imported into the United States prior to the effective date of certification. 40 C.F.R.§ 1068.103(c). CAA § 203(a)(1), 42 U.S.C. § 7522(a)(1), prohibits the importation or introduction into U.S. commerce of new small spark-ignition equipment unless they are covered by a valid COC or are properly excluded. By importing the Subject Generators and introducing them into U.S. commerce without certification, Innovative Energy Solutions committed 78 violations of CAA §§ 203(a)(1) and 213(d), 42 U.S.C. §§ 7522(a)(1) and 7547(d).
