

EPA BROWNFIELDS RESOURCES

Through grants, technical assistance and educational outreach, U.S. EPA provides multiple resources to prepare brownfields for safe redevelopment.



PROPERTY CLEANUP

EPA funds cleanup of contaminated properties to reduce risks to public health and help facilitate redevelopment



CLEANUP PLANNING

EPA funds cleanup planning and coordination with regulatory agencies to help find solutions for safe redevelopment.



ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENTS

EPA funds assessments of historic property use to determine if contaminants are present and to estimate the cost of addressing environmental concerns on a property.



FINANCING SCENARIOS

EPA funds identification of resources and the development of multi-layered funding plans to support brownfields cleanup and reuse.



PRE-DEVELOPMENT PLANNING

EPA funds market studies, land use assessments, infrastructure evaluations and other studies to determine the types of redevelopment projects a brownfield can financially support.



REUSE CONCEPTS

EPA funds brownfields site reuse visioning and conceptual design development to articulate specific redevelopment goals.



COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

EPA funds community outreach and participation to ensure residents have a role in defining future projects that shape their neighborhood.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

EPA funds training in environmental technician skills to support local job hiring in environmental cleanup and community revitalization.



PARTNERSHIP BUILDING

EPA funds coordination across stakeholders and agencies to build broad support for brownfields redevelopment.
