**PROJECT DESCRIPTION**: The Water Reclamation Facility Improvements Project will include installation of a cloth media filter system, new disinfection system, and other structural modifications at the William E. Dunn Water Reclamation Facility and improvement of the grit removal system at the South Cross Bayou Water Reclamation Facility. The purpose of the projects is to upgrade the William E. Dunn Water Reclamation Facility to improve operability and reliability of treated water quality and to upgrade the South Cross Bayou Water Reclamation Facility to prevent plant overflows during extreme weather events and provide the most economical delivery approach available.


## FY 2018 SELECTION ROUND

## NUMBER OF PROJECTS SELECTED: 39

**TOTAL LOAN AMOUNT:** \$5 billion to public and private entities

TOTAL WATER INFRASTRUCTURE INVESTMENT SUPPORTED: Over \$10 billion

**NUMBER OF PEOPLE IMPACTED:** 22 million in 16 states and Washington, D.C.



Selected borrowers must apply for a WIFIA loan, pass a final creditworthiness assessment, negotiate a mutually agreeable term sheet, and execute a credit agreement to receive WIFIA financing. An invitation to apply indicates that EPA believes the selected projects will be able to attain WIFIA loans



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
