Dear Mr. Smith, Ms. Kodish, and Mr. McPhedran:

On August 12, 2020, the Environmental Protection Agency ("the EPA" or "agency") published a final rule, "Promulgation of Air Quality Implementation Plans; State of Texas; Regional Haze and Interstate Visibility Transport Federal Implementation Plan," 85 Fed. Reg. 49,170. On October 13, 2020, you submitted a petition for partial reconsideration of the above-captioned rule which is commonly known as the "Texas Regional Haze BART and Interstate Visibility Transport FIP." The petition was submitted on behalf of the Sierra Club, National Parks Conservation Association, and Earthjustice pursuant to section 307(d)(7)(B) of the Clean Air Act.

The EPA has considered your petition for partial reconsideration. Without conceding that the conditions for mandatory reconsideration are necessarily met pursuant to section 307(d)(7)(B), the agency recognizes that aspects of this action warrant careful review, and potentially modification, to ensure our actions are fully consistent with the requirements of the Clean Air Act and the Regional Haze Rule. *See* 40 C.F.R. part 51, subpart P. Thus, by this letter, the agency is convening a proceeding for reconsideration of the Texas Regional Haze BART and Interstate Visibility Transport FIP. At a later date the EPA will provide notice of our proposal on reconsideration and provide the opportunity for public comment.
