RE: Alternative Restoration Plan Acceptance for Great Pond

Dear Ms. Garland:

Thank you for submitting the Great Pond Watershed-Based Management Plan (dated March 2021) to EPA for acceptance as an alternative restoration plan. Great Pond was placed on the Clean Water Act (CWA) Section 303(d) list of impaired waters in 2010 due to elevated phosphorus levels and declining water clarity. The management plan (together with supplemental information in the submittal letter) includes an analysis of phosphorus loading, the reduction needed to meet water quality standards, specific actions needed to achieve that reduction, available funding sources to pay for needed actions, and a schedule and milestones to guide implementation progress.

Consistent with the EPA memorandum from Benita Best-Wong, dated August 13, 2015, with the subject line, "Information Concerning 2016 Clean Water Act Sections 303(d), 305(b) and 314 Integrated Reporting and Listing Decisions" and the EPA TMDL Vision framework ("the Vision")<sup>1</sup>, the submitted plan was written to inform and guide pollutant load reduction implementation. The plan includes the relevant elements specified in these memoranda and we accept the Great Pond Watershed-Based Management Plan as an alternative restoration plan to be counted towards WQ-27, which is a performance measure used to track progress in implementing the CWA 303(d) Program Vision, for FY2021.

Thank you again for your submittal of this thorough and informative restoration plan.
