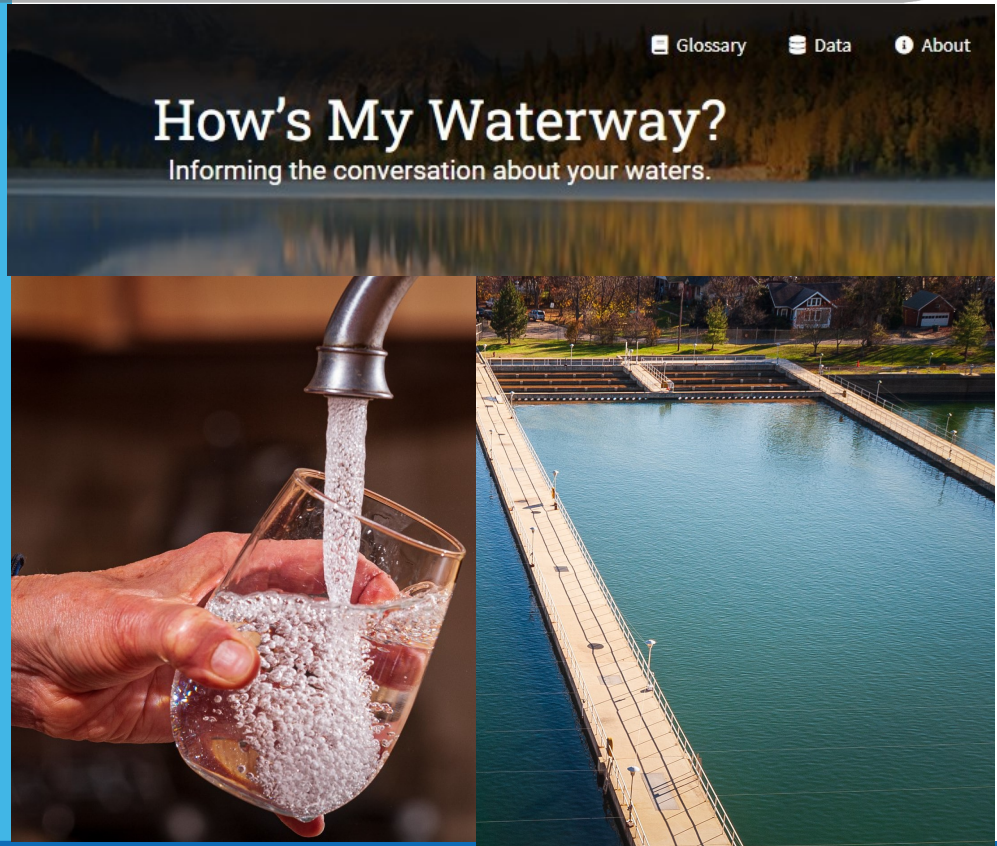


Growing Grassroots: Building Capacity for Environmental Justice Work in the Southeast
