## Highlights of Early Input from States, Tribes and Associations

- Review all priorities to make sure there is adequate consideration of tribal needs.
- Continue efforts on PFAS.
- The TPPC would like to be involved with or comment on any measures being developed.
- The FIFRA Work Plan and Reporting Template that is now online (known as the FIFRA Grants Database) contains fields that do not work for all tribes.
- Expand the pollinators section to include native pollinators.
- There is a desire for EPA to provide funds to tribes without pesticide programs or cooperative agreements. In addition, funding should be made available for work in the non-agricultural arena.
- The EPA Bee Inspection Guidance focuses on bees and does not provide guidance on how to inspect incidents with pollinators that aren't bees or native bees.
- It would be good to include some Traditional Ecological Knowledge (TEK) measures in the NPG as well as a climate change goal or measure.
- More STAG funding is needed for state pesticide programs.
- EPA should work closely with the Association of American Pesticide Control Officials (AAPCO) on national pesticide issues.

- More funding is needed for TSCA delegated programs and infrastructure investments.
- EPA should do more consultation and coordination on TSCA risk review prioritization and methodologies.
- EPA should add additional PFAS and other contaminants of concern to TRI reporting requirements.
- EPA should renew efforts around pollution prevention and alternatives assessments, more funding should be available for state Pollution Prevention grants and make sustainable and green chemistry a priority.
- Promote state authorization to increase the number of Lead Based Paint authorized states.

## Next Steps

OCSP and the EPA regions will consider the early input received from state, territory, and tribal partners in developing the FY 2023-2024 National Program Guidance in the following manner:

- Will review all priorities to make sure there is adequate consideration of tribal needs.
- Involve tribes if/when pesticide measures are developed.
- Native pollinators will be considered in the pollinator section of the NPG.
- Continue to work closely with the TPPC (tribal partnership group) and AAPCO (state partnership group).
- Will review all Lead, TRI and P2 programs to ensure there is adequate consideration of state and tribal needs.
