Label Improvement Project

Project initiated by the Association of American Pesticide Control Officials (AAPCO) Board in 2019.

Goal: Development of the ideal label based on standardization, consistency, accuracy, understandability, and achieving compliance.

Label Improvement Project -Process and Teams-

Project will proceed in phases.

- Phase One: Development of Project Plan by Core Project Management Team.
- Phase Two: Project Execution by Implementation Teams.
 - Project Management Training

Label Improvement Project Core Project Management Team

- Comprised of pesticide regulatory officials from six states and staff from EPA's Offices of Pesticide Programs and Enforcement and Compliance Assurance.
- Created a framework or Plan for label improvement based on "areas for label improvement":
 - Formatting;
 - Enforceability;
 - Directions for Use and Language; and
 - Claims.
- Plan includes the Future of Labels.

Plan Development

- Core Team systematically reviewed areas of label improvement with attention to the following:
 - Implementation Teams—who needs to be engaged for successful execution
 - Scope—i.e. master label, marketplace, etc.
 - Common concerns
 - Needed resources
 - ► Timeline
 - Deliverables
 - Possible barriers to success

Current Status

Final DRAFT Plan:

- Summary of the reasons for and potential benefits of the project.
- Explanation of how this project will aid EPA efforts to improve and modernize labels, for example implementation of the Office of Pesticide Program Electronic Label (OPPEL) pilot.
- Summary of the team's discussions on the identified label improvement areas.
- Discussion of a proposed work plan for the work identified but not yet completed.
- Following completion of final review of the draft document by the Core Team, the summary document will be submitted to AAPCO for review and approval.

Putting a Pin In It

The ongoing public health crisis has impacted progress and completion of the project.

Core Team Members impacted both professionally and personally.

- A formal Project Management Training was identified during the development process as essential to a comprehensive, long term, well planned and coordinated approach to label improvement.
 - The Core Team has chosen to postpone project management training until in person meeting is possible.
 - AAPCO supports Project Management Training.
