I would like to convey my gratitude to you and the Environmental Financial Advisory Board for your recommendations regarding to the Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund. Our team at the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency sincerely appreciates the board's thoughtful deliberations and recommendations regarding the design of this historic program.

As you know, President Joe Biden signed the Inflation Reduction Act into law August 16, 2022, representing the most aggressive action in tackling the climate crisis in American history. The Greenhouse Gas Reduction Fund is a flagship program in the IRA and represents a transformational opportunity for our country.
