Safer Choice helps consumers, businesses, and purchasers find products that perform and contain ingredients that are safer for human health and the environment. Safer Choice is an <u>EPA Pollution Prevention (P2) program</u>, which includes practices that reduce, eliminate, or prevent pollution at its source, such as using safer ingredients in products.

Finding cleaning and other products that are safer for you, your family, and the environment should be easy — that's why EPA developed the Safer Choice label. Everyone plays a role in protecting our families' health and the environment. Products with the Safer Choice label help consumers and commercial buyers identify products with safer chemical ingredients, without sacrificing quality or performance.

About 1,900 products currently qualify to carry the Safer Choice label. Safer Choice-certified products are available for use in <a href="https://example.com/hotels.

Cleaning products used to clean your school can impact the air you breathe. Safer Choice-certified products work well and contain ingredients that are better for indoor air quality and your students and personnel.

Everyone deserves access to products with safer ingredients. The Safer Choice label helps you find products that meet EPA's standards for ingredient safety, sustainability and performance. Before a product can carry the EPA Safer Choice label, EPA scientists confirm all ingredients are safer for fish and aquatic life and/or break down quickly in the environment. In addition, at least 25% of the product packaging must meet one or more sustainability criteria detailed in the Safer Choice Standard and cannot contain intentionally added heavy metals, BPA or phthalates.
