

National Pollutant Release Inventory reporting requirements: questions and answers

Question	Answer	Keywords	Category
My facility met all the NPRI criteria for the calendar year but I didn't have any releases or transfers; do I still have to report?	Yes. If you met the criteria then you have to report all releases and transfers, even if they were zero. One of the purposes of the NPRI is to report on-site substances at your facility for the year, even though releases and transfers are zero. The criteria for most substances are based only on quantity manufactured, processed or otherwise used, number of employees and concentration of NPRI substances. The reporting criteria for polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs), dioxins, furans, hexachlorobenzene (HCB) and criteria air contaminants (CACs) are all different and may be activity - or release-based. Once the substance-specific reporting criteria are met, you must report regardless of the quantities released, disposed of or transferred, even if the quantity is zero.	Employee; facility zero release; Gazette Notice; operator; owner; zero releases	Releases/Disposals/Transfers
Our facility closed partway through the calendar year. Are we required to submit an NPRI report?	Yes. If the reporting criteria were met and the facility was in operation during any portion of the calendar year, you are required to report. You should also notify Environment and Climate Change Canada of the facility closure this can be done by submitting a Facility Closure (Sale/Close/Purchase) report in the online reporting system. Providing this report will prevent follow-ups in subsequent years to verify compliance.	facility closure	Facility/Company



National Pollutant Release Inventory data search


Welcome to the new National Pollutant Release Inventory (NPRI) data search tool. You can use this tool to search detailed information on pollutant releases (to air, water and land), disposals and transfers for recycling reported by facilities to the NPRL You can also use this tool to display facility data by location, sector and substance as well as to view pollution prevention information.

The data presented here is current as of August 17, 2023.

Links to other datasets are available for facilities that also report to the Greenhouse Gas Reporting Program (GHGRP) and the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) on radionuclides.

Ad hoc – Cross Border Transfers

- Collaboration with Commission for Environmental Cooperation (CEC) on North American PRTR Data Quality
- Work on improving understanding of cross border transfers of NPRI substances to and from the United States
- Has led to identification of potential noncompliant facilities in Canada (i.e. non-reporting facilities that are receiving above threshold quantities of NPRI substances)

Community Involvement

Museums

- The NPRI team collaborates with museums to raise awareness of the impacts of pollutants released into the air, water and land. Examples of activities include:
 - Canada Agriculture and Food Museum
 - An <u>educational activity kit</u> for high school students that presents the impacts of land cultivation and livestock farming on the environment
 - An exhibition panel on tracking pollutants in Canada for the soil lab

Festivals

- The NPRI team participates in several festivals that promote science to youth across Canada. Examples of festivals include:
 - Festival Eurêka! in Montréal: we hosted a booth with interactive activities to help youth learn about the sources and impacts of water and air pollution
 - Various Canadian science fairs (for example, Expo-sciences): we formed part of a panel of judges to evaluate student science projects

Collaboration

Students

- The NPRI team hosts several activities that target students of all ages to increase awareness of pollution and pollution prevention.
- Each year, the NPRI team launches an Academic Challenge aimed at university, college and cégep students. With mentoring from Environment and Climate Change Canada staff, students are challenged to find innovative ways of using and analyzing NPRI data. Indigenous peoples

• The NPRI team aims to initiate discussions between those affected by pollution, researchers and policy-makers about the sources and impacts of pollution near Indigenous communities across Canada. With input from regional organizations, a series of interactive story maps were developed to examine facilities located near Indigenous communities in Québec and the pollutants they report to the NPRI.

International and Stakeholders

International collaboration

 The NPRI team plays a key role in advancing the development of Pollutant Release and Transfer Registers (PRTR) internationally, by participating in meetings and mentoring other countries to develop and implement their own PRTR. The team is an active participant in the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's Working Group on Pollutant Release and Transfer Registers. The team also collaborates on a regular basis with the Commission for Environmental Cooperation, which tracks and compares pollutant releases and transfers declared by Canada, Mexico and the United States.

Consultations

- The NPRI team consults with stakeholders regularly to continually improve information products and how they are communicated. The NPRI established a working group comprised of members of environmental non-governmental organizations and community groups, including Indigenous peoples. This engagement helps inform the NPRI's communication for information products and build potential partnerships.
- The NPRI organizes a biannual workshop for data users to better understand the challenges of compiling and disseminating data as well as identify possible ways of improving the program. Read about the latest consultations on the NPRI's <u>Consultation</u> and engagement webpage.
