Delegation Request

Dear Mr. Mathur:

This letter is to request delegation of authority to Indiana to implement and enforce federal standards promulgated under Section 112 of the Clean Air Act. This request is consistent with U.S. EPA's final rule addressing delegation of authority (65 FR 55809, September 14, 2000) and final rule approving Indiana's Section 112(I) Program of Delegation (62 FR 36460, July 8, 1997).

U.S. EPA issued final rules in July 1997, March 2000 and April 2004 delegating Indiana implementation and enforcement authority for Section 112(I) standards promulgated through those dates, respectively.

Based on prior program submittals and approvals for Indiana's Title V air permit and Section 112 delegation programs, Indiana has met the "up-front" approval requirements as specified in 40 CFR 63.91(d). The remaining criterion for approval is a demonstration that the State has adequate legal authority to implement and enforce the applicable federal standard. While incorporation of the federal requirements into the Title V air permit provides sufficient authority, Indiana also has incorporated the federal standards by reference into the state rules, providing legal authority outside of the Title V program.


This request covers those Section 112 standards adopted into Indiana rules, unchanged from the federal standard, since April 26, 2004. A copy of the state rule language is enclosed (Enclosure A). A list of Section 112 standards for which delegation has been requested but has not yet been granted is enclosed (Enclosure B) as well as is a complete list of previously delegated Section 112 standards (Enclosure C).
