Re: Delegation Update, 40 CFR 60 and 40 CFR 63

This letter is to notify your office of amendments to state rules to enforce federal standards promulgated under Section 112 (NESHAPS) and Section 111(c) (NSPS) of the Clean Air Act. The delegation mechanism for NESHAPS resides with U.S. EPA's final rule addressing delegation of authority (65 FR 55809, September 14, 2000) and final rule approving Indiana's Section 112(1) Program of Delegation (62 FR 36460, July 8, 1997) and for NSPS with Indiana's delegation memo dated April 5, 1988.

U.S. EPA issued final rules in July 1997, March 2000, April 2004, January 2006, August 2006, September 2006 (2), and July 2007, delegating Indiana implementation and enforcement authority for Section 112(l) standards promulgated through those dates, respectively.

NESHAPS

This notification covers those Section 112 standards adopted into Indiana Administrative Code at 326 IAC 20. LSA rulemaking #10-112 was effective on October 31, 2010, amending the definition to references to the <u>CFR at 326 IAC 1-1-3</u> to mean the July 1, 2009 edition. This annual update is the process that Indiana uses to update NESHAPS incorporated by reference at 326 IAC 20 to include amendments to NESHAPS made at the federal level. LSA rulemaking #10-112 also specifically amends 326 IAC 20-28 to remove the exceptions from 326 IAC 20-28-1(b) to simply incorporate by reference 40 CFR 63, Subpart EEE (NESHAP for Hazardous Waste Combustors). A complete list of previously delegated Section 112 standards (Enclosure A) is also enclosed.

The following standards were amended at the federal level between July 2008 and July 2009:

LSA rulemaking #10-112 was effective on October 31, 2010, amending the definition to references to the CFR at 326 IAC 1-1-3 to mean the July 1, 2009 edition. This annual update is the process that Indiana uses to update 326 IAC 12, which incorporates by reference 40 CFR 60, to include amendments to NSRS made at the federal level.
