Dear Mr. Czerniak:

Pursuant to the May 1996 Memorandum of Agreement between the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA), Region 5, the MDEQ requests delegation of authority to implement and enforce the National Emissions Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAPs) for the following subparts of 40 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 63:

Subpart A, General Provisions for Emission Standard.

Subpart M, Asbestos.

Subpart N, Chromium Emissions from Hard and Decorative Chromium Electroplating and Chromium Anodizing Tanks.

Subpart X, Secondary Lead Smelting.

Subpart EEE, Hazardous Waste Combustors.

Subpart LLL, Portland Cement Manufacturing.

Subpart IIII, Mercury Emissions from Mercury Cell Chlor-Alkali Plants.

Subpart EEEEEE, Primary Copper Smelting Area Sources.

Subpart FFFFF, Secondary Copper Smelting Area Sources.

Subpart GGGGG, Primary Nonferrous Metals Area Sources – Zinc, Cadmium, and Beryllium.

Subpart MMMMMM, Carbon Black Production Area Sources.

Subpart NNNNN, Chemical Manufacturing Area Sources: Chromium Compounds.

Subpart SSSSS, Glass Manufacturing Area Sources.

Subpart VVVVV, Chemical Manufacturing Area Sources.

The MDEQ incorporated by reference the above NESHAP Subparts without change into the Air Pollution Control Rules, under the authority of Part 55 Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994, Act 451, as amended. Rule 902 (R 336.1902) incorporates the standards by reference and was most recently updated effective May 20, 2015. Rules 941 (R 336.1941) through 944 (R 336.1944) were most recently updated on May 20, 2015. Rules 951 (R 336.1951) through 960 (R 336.1960) became

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effective on May 20, 2015. These rules require compliance with the standards by the subject sources. Enclosed are copies of the effective rules and the notice of filing of these rules by the Secretary of State.

We would appreciate timely attention to this request for delegation of the above NESHAP Subparts so the MDEQ can provide clear direction to facilities in their efforts to comply with the standards.
