RE: Approval of Delegation of National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Source Categories

Dear Mr. Smith:

Pursuant to the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, that was signed on February 15, 2005, EPA hereby delegates to MPCA the authority to implement and enforce the National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAPs) established under Section 112 of the Clean Air Act and codified in Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (C.F.R.), Part 63, for the following Source Categories:

National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Surface Coating of Automobiles and Light-Duty Trucks – 40 C.F.R. Part 63, Subpart IIII;

National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Major Sources for Industrial, Commercial, and Institutional Boilers and Process Heaters – 40 C.F.R. Part 63, Subpart DDDDD;

National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Mercury Emissions from Mercury Cell Chlor-Alkali Plants – 40 C.F.R. Part 63, Subpart IIIII; and

National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Coal and Oil-Fired Electric Utility Steam Generating Units – 40 C.F.R. Part 63, Subpart UUUUU.

By letter dated June 23, 2017 to EPA, MPCA provided proof of incorporation by reference of the NESHAPs referenced above into the state air quality regulations, as required by item III.A.3 of the MOA. MPCA codified the incorporations by reference of these NESHAPs in the Minnesota Administrative Rules at MINN. R. 7011.8140, 7011.7050, 7011.8080, and 7011.0563, respectfully. Item III.B.3 of the MOA requires EPA to respond to MPCA's written announcement of completing its rulemaking to incorporate NESHAPs by reference with a letter delegating enforcement authority of these standards.

MPCA has accepted the implementation authority for the above-referenced NESHAPs and incorporated these NESHAPs into the state air quality regulations. Thus, the authority to implement and enforce these NESAHPs is delegated to MPCA.
