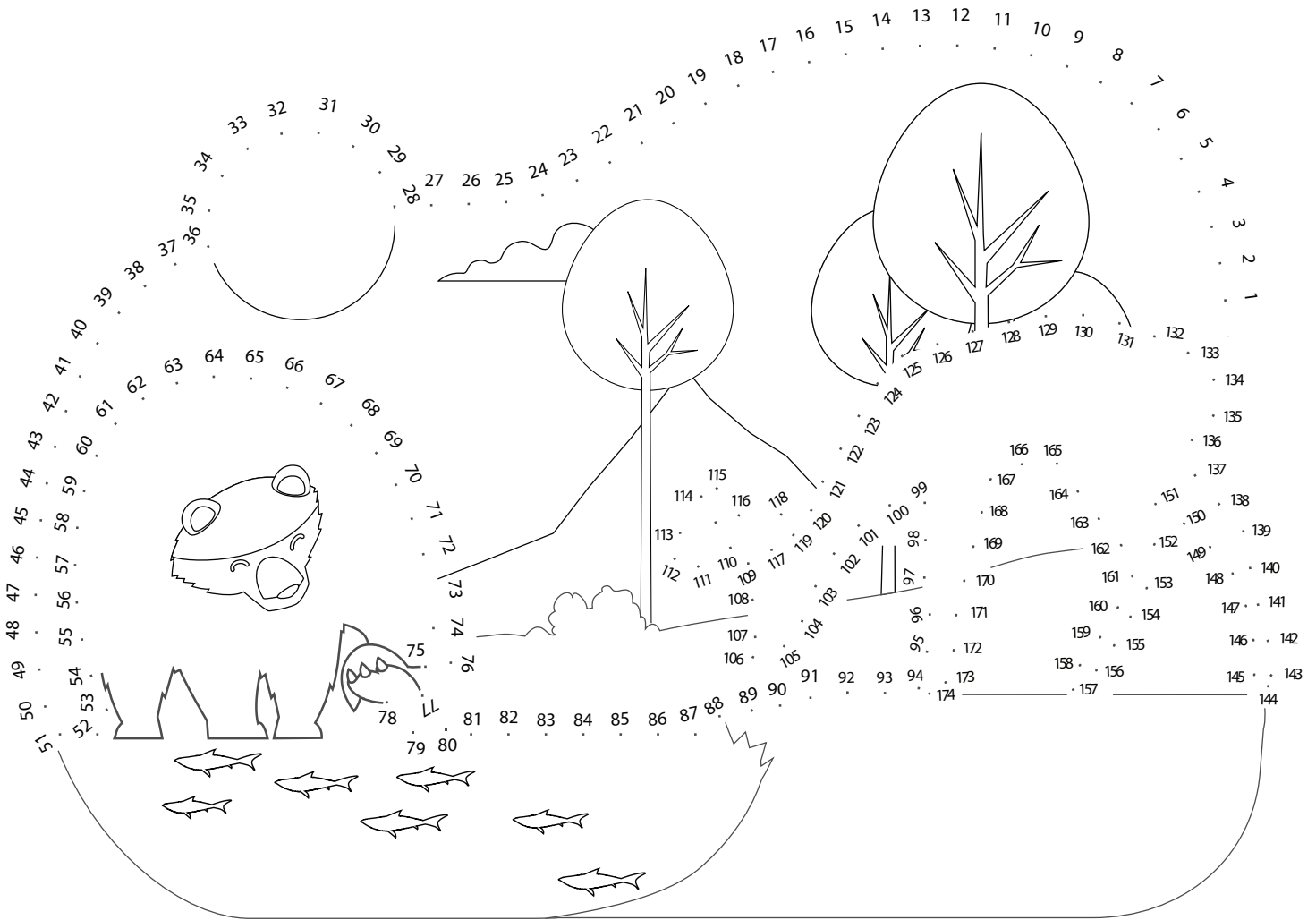

For longer activities such as sports practice, take some breaks and do easier activities. Watch for asthma symptoms and take it easy, as needed.

Great day to be active outside! For **all outdoor activities**, take more breaks and do less intense activities.

Consider moving **longer or more intense activities** indoors or rescheduling them to another day or time.

Watch for symptoms and take action as needed.

Students with asthma should follow their asthma action plans and keep their quick-relief medicine handy.

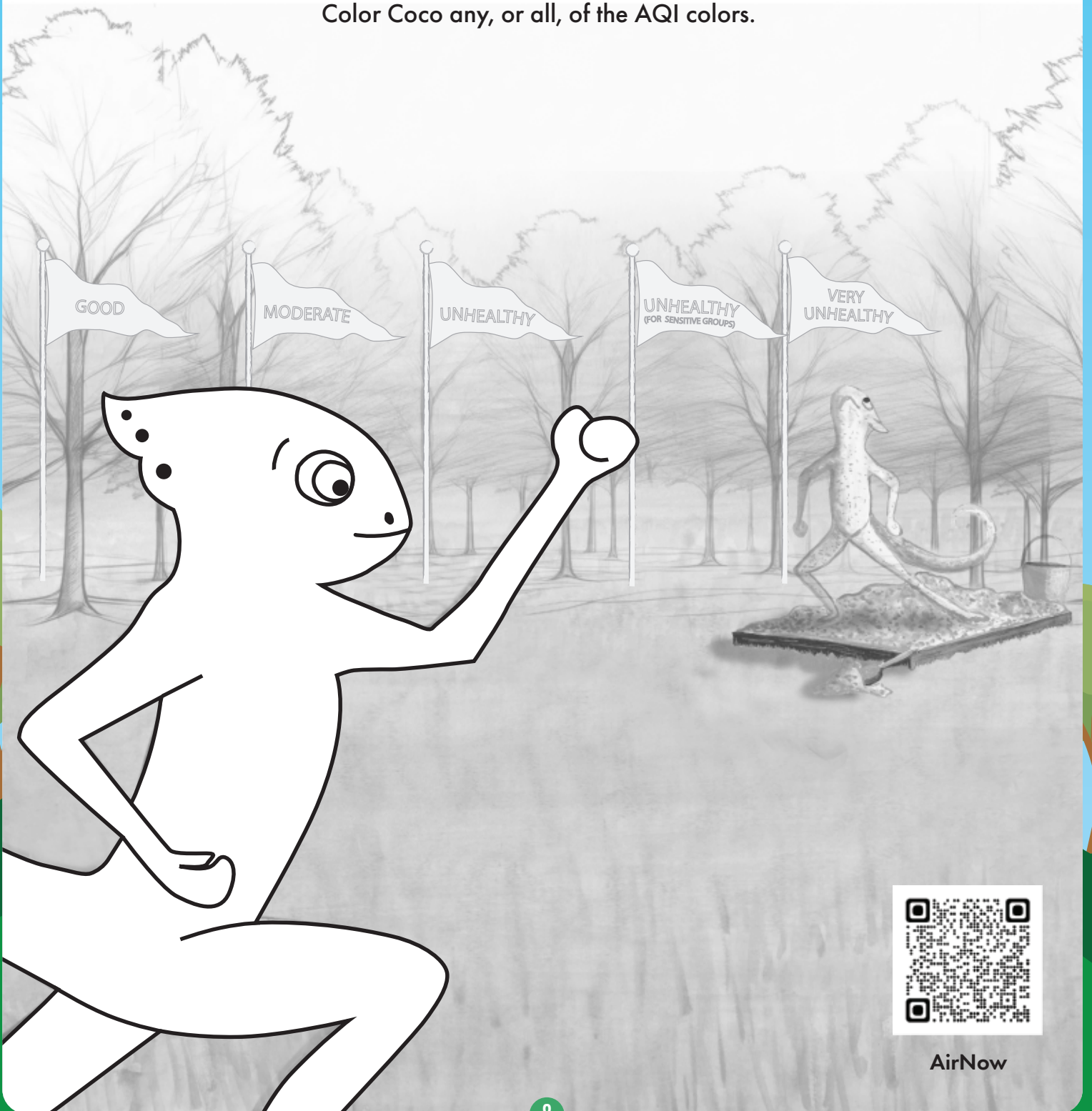


Good day to be active outside!

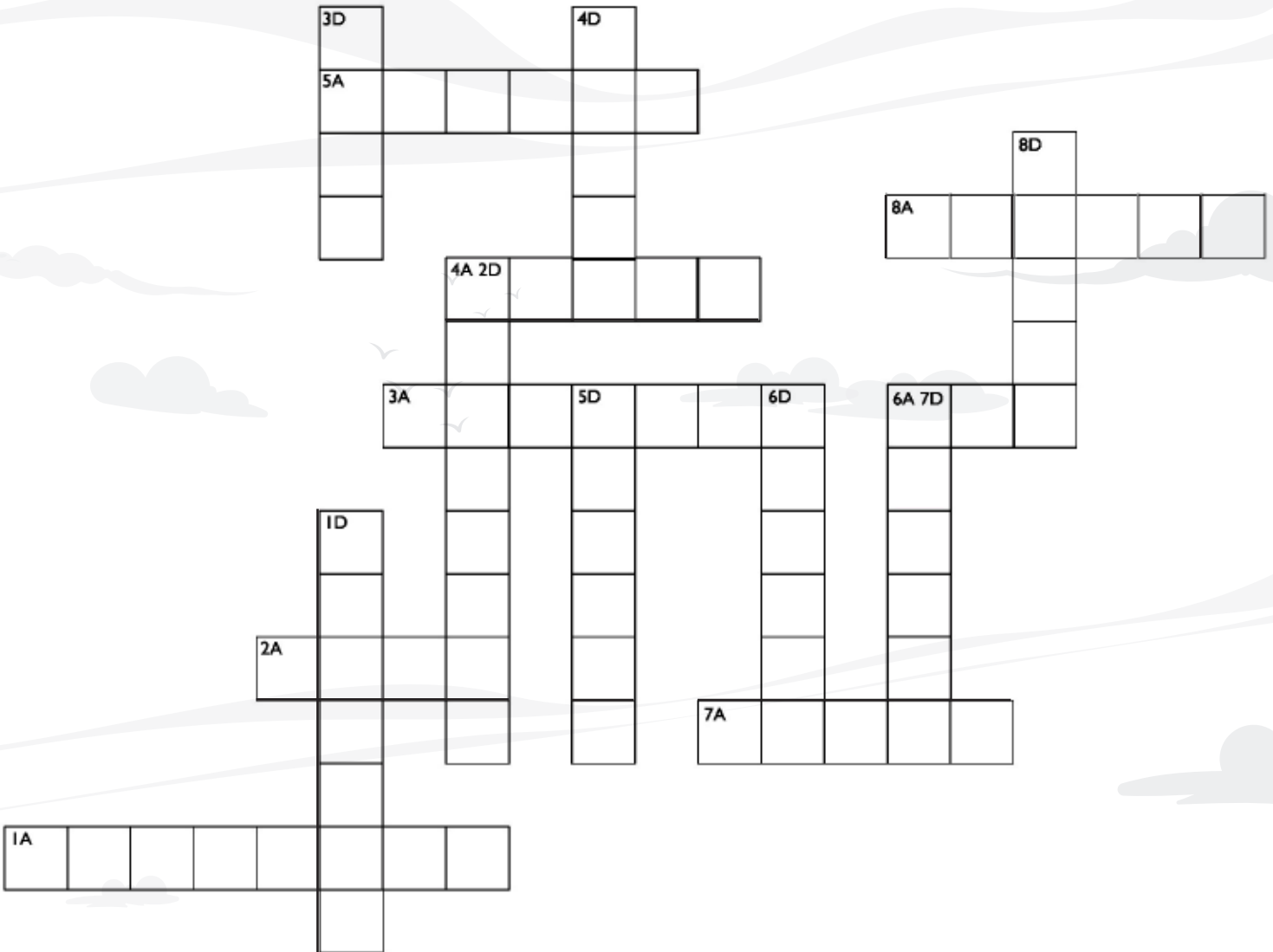
