OBJECTIVES

Finding access to federal funding can be a daunting task. Even after you've found a grant program, it can be difficult to determine if your project is applicable or if you're even eligible to apply. EPA can help you sift through the current federal environmental funding opportunities and make sense of your options. In most cases, partnering with a local, non-profit community group is the only way to access these grants. EPA can also help to connect you with these groups.
