Question: You can only focus on one neighborhood or at least one?

Answer: Applicants must identify only one target area they propose to serve. A target area can be any area (e.g., county(ies), lands of Federally Recognized Tribes, a number of neighboring towns or cities, a district, a corridor, a shared planning area, or a census tract, etc.) that is impacted by the presence of one or more brownfield sites. EPA will consider applications that propose to serve large geographical areas, especially rural communities that include a number of towns and/or Tribal lands, as well as applicants able to serve sister-cities (partnership between U.S. cities located in different states). Please see Section I.A. *Description of the Grant* and Section III.B.8. *Target Area* of the FY 2025 Brownfields Job Training Grants Request for Applications (RFA) for more information on what is considered a target area.

Question: Is there a map where "official" brownfields are located, or can sites that have general brownfields characteristics qualify?

Answer: The Cleanups in My Community Map: https://www.epa.gov/cleanups/cleanups-my-community has the location of many brownfields across the United States and its territories. Answer: No, there is no minimum specific monetary amount the organization needs to be valued at in order to be awarded a Brownfields Job Training Grant; however, the organization must be either a certain eligible entity as defined in CERCLA 104(k)(1) (42 U.S.C. 9604(k)(1)) or other

eligible nonprofit organizations as defined in 2 CFR 200.1. Please see Section III.A. *Who Can Apply?* of the FY 2025 Brownfields Job Training Grants RFA for more information.
