



Public Notice: Extension of Public Comment Period on Proposed Air Quality Permit to Operate for PotlatchDeltic, LLC – St. Maries Complex

On August 21, 2024, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) proposed to issue an air quality permit to operate for PotlatchDeltic Land and Lumber, LLC – St. Maries Complex on the Coeur d’Alene Reservation. The EPA has received requests for additional time to review the administrative record and comment on the proposed permit. Pursuant to 40 CFR 71.11(g), the EPA is extending the comment period on the proposed permit that was scheduled to close on September 20, 2024, by an additional 31 days, until October 21, 2024.

The comment period closes on October 21, 2024.

Will there be a public hearing?

No public hearing has been scheduled; however, you may request a public hearing. A request for a hearing must be submitted by September 20, 2024 (unchanged from deadline in August 21 notice), and must include the nature of the issues to be raised at the hearing. EPA will base its decision on whether a hearing will be held upon the showing of a significant degree of public interest.

What happens next?

The EPA will review and consider all comments received during the comment period. Following this review, the EPA may issue the permit, issue the permit with revisions or deny the permit.
